The City recently launched a new mobile app for use by residents of The Village while on the go. The mobile phone app is currently available for iPhones and Android phones and can be downloaded for free at your mobile app store. When visiting your mobile app store, search for “City of The Village” and download the app just like you would any other app for your phone or iPad. The app provides a link to the online “Shop The Village” program that the city put in place several years ago. In addition, the app provides a link to the City’s Facebook Page and connects to several City webpages such as ePay eBill, Council Agendas, eNews, Recycling Calendars, Holiday Service Schedules, Scheduled Events, and more. OBN Prescription Drug Drop Box

On April 18th, The Village Police Department received a drug drop box from the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics (OBN). The purpose of the box is for citizens to have access to a convenient and safe way to dispose of old, unused prescription medication. It is not to be used for syringes, liquids, chemicals or inhalers.

OBN will periodically empty the box and have the medications destroyed.

The box is located in the lobby area of the police department and is available 24 hours a day.
